#### HISTORY OF CORPUS CHRISTI PARISH

#### The Pioneering Days

In 1989, the SSNIT Estate in Community 12, Sakumono Estates, Tema, were allocated to interested applicants. Among the residents were a good number of enthusiastic Catholics. Even though they continued to attend Church Services at their previous Parishes, there was a burning desire for the establishment of a Catholic Church at the new locality.

A delegation met with the then Bishop of Accra, His Lordship the (Late) Right Reverend Dominic Kodwo Andoh, to discuss the possibility of starting a new church at Community 13, Sakumono Estates. The Bishop agreed to assist this small community which fell under the jurisdiction of Good Shepherd Catholic Church, Community 2,Tema. Consequently, on February 10,1991, the first Holy Mass was celebrated in the Sakumono Estates Community with the then Priest-in-Charge of the Good Shepherd Church, Reverend Father Patrick Twi (of Blessed memory), as the celebrant. As time went on, Rev. Fr. James Duncan of the Centenary House, Accra, was asked by the Bishop to take in charge of the Sunday Mass whilst the Good Shepherd Parish continued to shepherd the then Small Catholic Church at Sakumono as its outstation.

The yard in the SSNIT Estates office was one of the first places where Holy Mass was celebrated in the community. This yard however had no walls, so the place was found to be quite inconvenient. As the number of people attending Holy Mass continue to increase, the late Mr. Emmanuel Comla Otabil, who had then walled his house, together with his wife, offered the use of their house for Holy Mass.

Sometime later, it became apparent that the Otabils' residence too could not be used for long in view of the increasing size of the congregation. Some of the members went to discuss a possible move to the Bethel Nursery School, which was not too far away from the Otabils' home with the then headmistress of the School, Ms. Patience Grace Bonney, a Methodist. She readily agreed to allow the Church to celebrate Holy mass in her school. However, since the same place was already being used by Methodist Church, The Catholic Church had to schedule its Sunday Mass very early in the morning and leave the premises by 9:00am to make room for the Methodist Church.

Later in the year, SSNIT completed work on another school building in the flats of the Sakumono Estates. This school was handed over to the Catholic Education Unit of the Ghana Education Service in September 1992 to run as the Holy Child Nursery and Basic School. A decision was then taken to start worship at the

Holy Child Nursery Block which has a spacious pavilion that could accommodate the growing numbers.

A wooden alter was constructed there and Rev. Fr. James Duncan continued to celebrate Holy Mass with the Catholic Community at this venue, as well as provide spiritual support. Thus, with the cooperation of priests from the Good Shepherd Parish, The Church forged ahead in unity and harmony.

The only Societies that existed in the early days of the Church were: the Knights of the Alter, the Lay Readers or Lectors' Association, the illustrious Choir and the Catholic Charismatic Renewal Group. The very first Church Pastoral Council was made up of the following:

In July 1991, a few changes were made in the membership of the Church Pastoral Council due to the departure of the then Secretary, Mr. Peter Egyir, to Canada. Mr. George Fidelis Dakpallah was appointed Secretary with Mr. Louis Doe Atsiatorme as the Assistant Secretary.

Eight Children were baptized into the Church August 10<sup>th</sup> ,1991, by Rev. Fr. Seth Awo –Doqu. Just around the same time, in order to meet the aspirations of most members, the Church Pastoral Council decided to organise the first Harvest with the aim of raising funds for building a Chapel. The Harvest Committee formed then was made up of Messrs Kingsley Attah-Karikari, Simon Kwakye (of blessed memory), Edmund Collins Ahadome, Francis Mensah-Aborampah, Lawrence Ayagiba (the Architect) and Mrs. Hannah Dankwa-Smith.

The Harvest came off on December1, 1991 at the Bethel School Park and yielded GHS78.40 (or 784,035 old cedis). Soon after this event, Rev. Fr. Awo-Doqu, who was leading the Church-building effort, was transferred from Tema; and in his place came equally energetic priest, Rev. Fr. Francis Asagba.

Some unforgettable occurrences in 1992 include:

- 1. The passing away of Mr. Emmanuel Comla Otabil, the first indefatigable Chairman of the Church Pastoral Council, which saddened the hearts of many.
- 2. The pastoral and memorable visit of the then Bishop of Accra, The Right Reverend Dominic Kwodwo Andoh (of blessed memory), paid to his flock at Sakumono.

At the beginning of 1993, Rev. Fr. Peter Baddoo was posted to the Good Shepherd Parish as the Priest-In-Charge. This transfer was followed by the announcement of the elevation of the late Bishop Dominic Kodwo Andoh as the Archbishop of Accra. A new Church Pastoral Council was inducted into office with membership as follows:

Hard-working Priest who served at the Corpus Christi Catholic Church, Sakumono Estates, during the pioneering days, and whose contributions are very well remembered are: Rev. Fathers Patrick Twi, James Duncan, Awo-Doqu, Emmanuel Nartey, Francis Asagba, Edmund Donkor-Baine, John Amoah, Edmund Neizer and Andrew Campell.

#### The Acquisition of Land for the Chapel

The acquisition of land for the Chapel did not come easily. The Tema Development Corporation (TDC) had originally approved the space on which the Corpus Christi Catholic Church and the Presbyterian Church of Hope now stand, to be shared with two other Churches , namely the Anglican and the Methodist Churches. However , after inspecting the place, the Anglicans and Methodists declined the offer as the place was too small for four Churches. Several events took place in the interim with the final heave by Mr. Oliver Ohene-Djan, a parishioner, who at that time was the Director of Finance with TDC. He ensured that we got the land for the Church and the plot on which the Rectory is now magnificently located. This effort made by Mr. Oliver Ohene-Djan is highly commendable.

### **Building the Chapel**

Members of the Catholic community right from the beginning showed, and still continue to display, tremendous generosity towards the Church. This motivated the late Archbishop Dominic Kodwo Andoh (Bishop Emeritus) to give approval for the building to commence and to make an initial donation of 50,000 US dollars towards the building of the Church . The sod-cutting ceremony which preceded the commencement of work was performed by the Late Archbishop on December 10, 1994.

Funding was mostly form the Church's own resources through the organization of various harvest chaired by parishioners including: Messrs Raphael Tuffour, Mensah Aborampah, Edward Musey, Sosu, Attipoe and many others. The youth were also very helpful during such harvest. However, on occurrences when the project ran short of money, the late Archbishop was kind enough to intervene by way of credit grants. Also, the role played by Rev. Father James Duncan of the Centenary House will forever remain in the minds of the Church's pioneering members. For, on each occasion that Fr. Duncan went home on leave (to Ireland his home country), he was able to raise no less than one million cedis to support development projects of the Church. The original Building Committee members who worked assiduously to ensure project completion were: Messrs. Anthony Fesu, Edmund Collins Ahadome, Lawyer K. Atta- Karikari, Frances Mensah-Aborampah, Lawrence Ayagiba (the Architect), and Mrs. Hannah Dankwah-Smith.

Mr. Manalo, a Philippino was also involved in the church design form inception. The project itself was undertaken by a building company which was jointly —owned by Messrs. John Dadzie and Francis Baffoe, under the registered name of Union Dateck.

### Naming of the Church

Interestingly, it was during Rev. Fr. Emmanuel Nartey's term of office that various Committees were formed, and each one was mandated to come up with a name that would be used by the Church as her official name. Some members of the Committees had already been fascinated by well-known Church names like: Our Lady of Mercy, Christ the King, Holy Child, Star of the Sea, Morning Star, Martyrs of Uganda and many more. They therefore wanted a complete change from the continuous use of similar well-known names for Catholic Churches.

One of the Committees made of Mr. Anthony Awortwe Dadzie, Mr. Emmanuel Comla Otabil and Mrs. Hannah Dankwa-Smith scrutinized the Catholic Calendar

and with much thought and deliberation selected the name Corpus Christi. This holy name symbolizes a deeply religious festivity on the Catholic calendar.

Rev. Fr. Nartey submitted to late Archbishop Andoh the names proposed by the various Committees for his choice and approval. At a subsequent Holy Mass, an official announcement was made out of the list of names proposed, Corpus Christi had been selected as the officially designated name for the Catholic Church at Sakumono Estates.

#### **Day Group Concept and Slogan**

It is worth mentioning that right from the onset of the Church, members agreed to run affairs strictly on Day Group basis. This meant that anything organised on tribal or ethnic lines would not be tolerated by the Church. For this reason, right from the very beginning, services have always been conducted only in the English language: his feature has remained till date. The Day Group concept has fostered a deep sense of belonging, togetherness and brotherliness among members. It has also made parishioners active participants in Church programmes and activities.

Accordingly, the first slogan or greeting of the Church, which was "Corpus Christi" to which one would reply "My Lord My God" was revised to "Corpus Christi" to which the reply was "UNITY". In recent times, the reply has changed to "UNITY IN CHRIST". Parishioners today look back with pride for taking that bold decisions, as this has brought about the unity the Church very much desires and cherishes.

# The triumphant entry

Initially, some church members opposed the idea of celebrating Holy mass in the uncompleted church building. But after Rev.Fr. Nartey's firm stand and persuasion, they all accepted to move and on Palm Sunday, April 5, 1998, the church building was occupied in a historic celebration, amidst brass band music,

joy and jubilation: reminiscent of Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Thus, this memorable day was described as the "**Triumphant Entry**".

Constructional work continued unabated until the project was completed and on Saturday, October 8, 2005, the church building (designed in the shape of a ship, symbolic of the Pilgrim Church) was eventually dedicated to the glory of the Almighty by the new Metropolitan Archbishop of Accra, Most Reverend Charles Gabriel Palmer-Buckle. Thus, the Corpus Christi Catholic Church, Sakumono Estate, became a Parish in 2005 with Very Rev. Fr. Frederick Agyeman as the first Parish Priest, assisted by Rev. Fr. Richard Aziati, who was later succeeded by Rev. Fr. Francis Destiny Amenuvor.

Rev. Fr. Agyeman, on September 6, 2010, left Ghana for further studies in the USA. On November 1, 2010 the Church welcome the new Parish Priest, Rev. Fr. Joseph Henry Mensah who was assisted by Rev. Fr. Philip Bempong.

#### Additional achievements of the Church within the first 20 years.

Apart from the Holy Child Basic School, the Church in 1995 started another educational complex- Corpus Christi Catholic School (from Kindergarten to Senior High School) at Community 18. Both schools are rated among the top schools in the Tema Metropolis in terms of academic performance, and this is the church's modest contribution to

- 1. The development of education in the country.
- 2. A rectory, meeting hall complex and offices were completed adding to the infrastructure of the Church.
- 3. The Church produced one priest with four studying in the seminary.
- 4. A very dynamic youth choir, the Philharmonic Choir, was established alongside the Main Choir.
  - 5. An education Endowment Fund was established in 2007 to assist brilliant but needy pupils and students of the Parish.
    - 6. 4C's Credit Union was established in February, 2006.

### Significant Achievements in the Past Five Years of the Church (2011-2016)

Since the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of the Corpus Christi Catholic Church in the year 2011, the Church has not rested on its oars but has continued to grow in strength and deed. Achievements of the Corpus Christi Catholic Church, Sakumono, in the last five years consist of modification and completion of earlier initiatives as well as new ones. They include:

- Efforts to improve the spiritualty of the Church in the Sprit Seminar, Advent Vespers, revision of the Children's Service to incorporate Catechism classes, modification of Hour Of Grace and Commissioning of members of the various ministries (such as Lectors, Knights and ladies of the Alter and Ushers)
- 2. Some projects completed are: the construction of a Grotto at the Church premise, the acquisition of the piece of land for a cemetery in Dawenya (Angels' Land), acquisition of the Holy Child Nursery and Basics Schools and the construction of a Relaxation Centre at the Holy Child School. Other projects still in progress are the construction of an additional classroom at the Holy Child School and construction of a Sports Complex at the Corpus Christi School.

- 3. Development of the Staff Conditions of Service and Employment Policy Manual and the Staff Performance Appraisal Form. There has also been a major review of the Welfare Policy Guideline.
- 4. Ordination of four priest and one Rev. Sister who are all parishioners of Corpus Christi Catholic Church.
- 5. There is also one seminarian (parishioner) at Pedu.
- 6. Organization of the first International Pilgrimage to Israel and Rome and the sponsorship of the three parishioners to attend the World Youth Day Conference in Krakow, Poland.
- 7. Renovation of the Corpus Christi Chapel with Construction of a Public Address room, new Tabernacle and glass paintings.
- 8. Intensification of Evangelisation including: paying annual visits to prisons( charity work), opening of an outstation in Borteyman in January, 2016 and initiation of the building of a Chapel for the St. Augustine Church at Old Ningo, to commemorate the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Corpus Christi Church.
- 9. Also to commemorate the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Corpus Christi parish was the composition of the Corpus Christi Parish Anthem by Mr. Benedictus Sackey (University of Cape Coast). The Anthem was out-doored at the launch of the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of the Church in February, 2016.
